

Color, Color, All Around: Material and Supply Sheet

This is one of my favorite quilts!!! Maybe it's the colors, or perhaps, it's the way you can just turn the blocks and come up with so many different designs! Whatever it is, it sings to my soul! Have fun with this one, but watch out! It could be addictive!

Finished Quilt: 50" x 50"

Finished Block: 6" x 6"

Materials:

I love to work with border print fabrics even though it means a lot of "fussy cutting". It also means that because we're not using all the fabric, there's quite a bit of fabric that goes to waste. ***Therefore, the instructions for this dazzling quilt are given for non-border print fabrics.*** If you want to use a border print fabric as I have, you'll need at least 2 yards for the border alone, and then enough fabric to fussy cut thirty six $6 \frac{7}{8}$ " triangles; for me, this meant I needed a total of 5 yards of border fabric!

Sewing Machine, in good working order and with $\frac{1}{4}$ " stitch capability

Iron and press board

Scissors, pins, thread (seam ripper, just in case)

Acrylic placement guide and $\frac{1}{4}$ " Steam-A-Seam 2 (***provided in kit***)

Rotary cutter, mat and ruler (if cutting anything in class)

Template plastic and Magic Mirrors (if fussy cutting border print)

Yardage is based on 42" wide fabric unless otherwise indicated.

2 $\frac{5}{8}$ yards of focus fabric for blocks, border and binding (should have at least 4 colors) (5 yards if using border print)

$\frac{1}{3}$ yard of dark blue for blocks

$\frac{1}{3}$ yard ***each*** of medium blue, medium gold, medium green and medium red for blocks and prairie points

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard ***each*** of dark gold, dark green and dark red for blocks

Pre-Workshop Instructions:

Cutting: I ***always*** have everyone pre-cut their fabric; that way we can make the best possible use of class time!

All measurements include 1/4" wide seam allowances.

From the focus fabric, cut:

- 3 strips, 6 7/8" x 42"; crosscut into 18 squares, 6 7/8" x 6 7/8". Cut each square in half diagonally to yield 36 triangles. (***if using a border print, wait and cut at workshop***)
- 6 strips, 7 1/2" x 42" for border (you may want to wait and cut this later)
- 6 strips, 2" x 42" (for binding, again, you may want to wait and cut this later)

From the dark blue fabric, cut:

- 3 strips, 2 7/8" x 42"; crosscut into 36 squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut each square in half diagonally to yield 72 triangles.

From the medium blue fabric, cut:

- 2 strips, 2 7/8" x 42"; crosscut into 18 squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut each square in half diagonally to yield 36 triangles.
- 3 strips, 2 5/8" x 42"; crosscut into 36 squares, 2 5/8" x 2 5/8".

From each of the dark gold, dark green and dark red fabrics, cut:

- 2 strips, 2 7/8" x 42"; crosscut into 24 squares (72 total), 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut each square in half diagonally to yield 48 triangles. (144 total)

From each of the medium gold, medium green and medium red fabrics, cut:

- 1 strip, 2 7/8" x 42"; crosscut into 12 squares (36 total), 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut each square in half diagonally to yield 24 triangles (72 total)
- 2 strips, 2 5/8" x 42"; crosscut into 24 squares (72 total), 2 5/8" x 2 5/8"
